

Judith Content Biography

A full-time studio artist for thirty years, Judith Content has exhibited her work throughout the United States as well as in Japan, Indonesia, Taiwan, the United Kingdom, Canada, Belgium and France. Her work has been included in **Quilt National** and **Quilt Visions** as well as three major traveling exhibitions: **Craft in America; Expanding Traditions, Masters: Art Quilts** and the landmark SAQA exhibition **12 Voices**.

Content has work in the permanent collections of the Palo Alto Medical Foundation, Mountain View location, Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco, the Museum of Contemporary Arts and Design, New York, NY, the San Jose Museum of Quilts and Textiles, San Jose, CA, the International Shibori Collection, Nagoya, Japan, Women Beyond Borders, the contemporary quilt collection of John M. Walsh III as well as Karey Bresenhan's International Quilt Festival collection, Houston, TX.

She served three years on the Textile Arts Council Board of Directors, ancillary to the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco, CA, as well as three full terms on the Foundation Board of the Palo Alto Art Center (CA) where she continues to volunteer. Judith has been featured on the television show *Simply Quilts* and served as a juro for *Quilt VISIONS* 2009.
